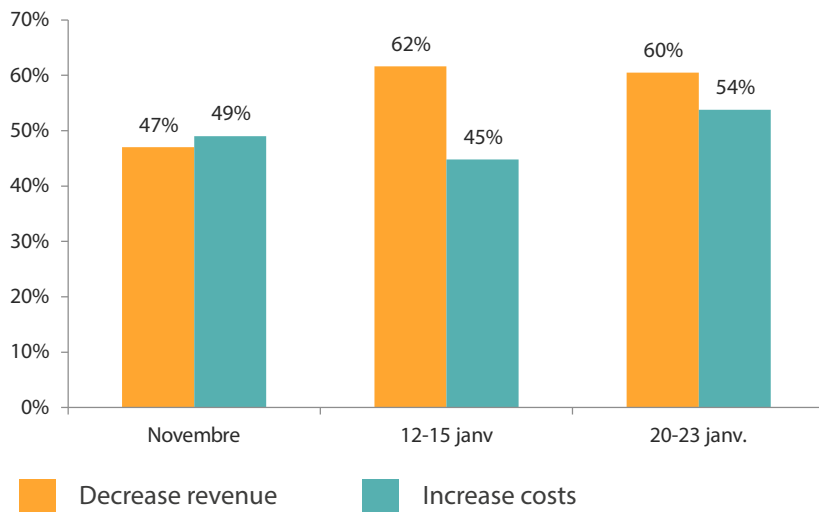


# SOCIO-ECONOMIC IMPACTS OF THE COVID-19 CRISIS ON HOUSEHOLDS IN THE DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC OF THE CONGO

Percentage of Households experiencing a fall in income and increased costs



## Weekly report of Household survey conducted from January 20 to 23, 2021

- Households reporting a fall in income remains higher in January 2021 than in November.
  - For low-income households 72% reported a fall in income in January 12-25.
  - Higher than 64% seen in November 2020.
- Between 12-15th January and 20-23th the number of households reporting increased costs rose from 45% to 54%.
  - Compared to 47% in November 2021.
- In the latest poll, 86% of respondents said restrictions were having a significant negative economic on their community.
  - Up from 77% between 20-23th Jan.

The data collection phase was administered by the Congo Call Center with the support of Orange RDC for the verification of the results.
